

RULES AND REGULATIONS -- CLUB PROPERTY

USE OF BEACH COMMON AREA

The following rules have been adopted by the Board of Trustees in accordance with the authority provided in the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of Cape George Colony Club. They will make beach users aware of existing State laws, covenants, and rules and regulations that will help preserve the beach and member's enjoyment in ways that are compatible with our residential neighborhood on Discovery Bay with its close proximity to the National Wildlife Refuge at Protection Island.

- Private Beach for Members , Guests and authorized Tenants Use Only
- No Overnight Camping Without Board Authorization
- No Open Fires Without Board Authorization
- No Fireworks Without Board Authorization
- No Littering – Place All Refuse in Provided Containers
- Clam Digging by Members , Accompanied Guests and Authorized Tenants Only
- Fill All Holes After Digging (WAC 220-56-355)
- No Removal of Large Rocks, or Wood Debris
- No Harassment of Wildlife (RCW 77.15.130)
- No Unauthorized Vehicles Allowed on Beach
- No Personal Watercraft (Jet Skis) Allowed on Beach, Ramps, or Marina Without Board Authorization
- Vehicles Without Member Decals , Tenant Decals or Guest Passes Will Be Removed at Owner's Expense

A "personal watercraft" is defined as "a vessel of less than sixteen (16) feet in length that is propelled by machinery, commonly a jet pump, and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on the vessel, rather than being operated by a person sitting or standing inside the vessel."
